Enrollment Policy:

The Recreation Division programs are offered to Reading and Non-Reading Residents unless otherwise noted in the program description. Programs in high demand will give priority to Reading Residents and students currently enrolled in the Reading Public School System. At the Recreation Administrator's discretion, some Recreation sponsored events may only be open to Reading residents. Non-Reading Residents will be charged a \$5 fee upon registration.

Online Registration

Most programs are available to be registered for on-line @ www.readingrec.com. Programs that offer special discounts will need to be paid for directly at the Recreation Division as discounts can not be taken on-line. Patrons can still fill out the form on-line and mail or hand deliver the form and payment to the office.

Refunds:

Reading Recreation is excited to partner with Boating in Boston to bring more Outdoor Recreation to the Town of Reading. We would like to share with you a little background about the company and encourage you to view the programs that they will be offering to our Town. THANK YOU!

The story actually starts in 2002, in the small New England hometown of Hopkinton, Massachusetts. That's where a charismatic man named Barry began the boating vision by opening Outdoor Recreation of Hopkinton, a kayak rental concession in Hopkinton State Park.

The word started getting around and the business grew and grew, bringing forth a community of water lovers. And soon Barry was introducing sailing and summer camps and boating season passes to the park.

In 2005, the Department of Conservation and Recreation approached Outdoor Recreation to get something going at Spot Pond in Stoneham, MA. Soon enough, Outdoor Recreation's boat rentals became a thriving business that continues today.

In 2009, Barry sold his business to a group of friends, all who met within the boating community and shared a tremendous passion for the water. Together, they kept Outdoor Recreation's vision alive and continued opening boathouses around their New England homes. They changed the company name to Boston Outdoor Recreation, Inc., also known as Boating in Boston and Boating in DC.

After four years of continued success, the group set sail in search of new waters. In 2013, friends in Washington, D.C., reached out and we jumped at the opportunity to operate the Key Bridge Boathouse for the National Park Service, keeping the spirit of John "Jack" Baxter alive by continuing his vision of public boat access on the Potomac River.

In 2016, Guest Services, Inc. acquired Boston Outdoor Recreation, Inc. to bring its successful team to more waterfronts across the East Coast.

Currently, Boating in Boston and Boating in DC operate boathouses in the greater Boston and Washington, D.C., areas. It has been an incredible experience thus far, and it's a great feeling for all to watch the team grow and see the passion for their work. 

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



FIELDS & PARKS RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All organized groups must receive a written permit from the Recreation Division, for the reserved use of a facility under the committee's jurisdtion. These facilities include the Tennis Courts, Basketball Courts, Parks, Fields, and Outdoor Skating areas
- All RMHS, Extra-Curricular Programs receive first priority for practice and games.
- Required Use before 5:45 PM during the school year must receive approval from the RMHS Athletic Director and a permit from the Recreation Division.
- Tennis Court Order of Priority High School Teams and Physical Education Classes, Recreation Staff, Programming, Adults 18 and Over (Weekdays After 5:00 PM and Sunday Mornings)
- 2. All groups who receive a permit must pay the applicable fee as adopted in the current fee schedule. The fee schedule is listed in the field permitting and fee policy located on the Recreation Division website.
- 3. Permitted use of any facility before noon on Sunday is prohibited except by special permit approved by the Recreation Committee.
- 4. Alcoholic Beverages are not permitted on any public property. If found in violation:
 - A. Permits may be revoked B. Violators may be subject to arrest and prosecution.
- 5. All groups must dispose of their own trash.
- 6. Animal waste must be removed by the pet owner. Dogs must be on a leash at all times.
- 7. Fire Arms, Destructive Weapons, Sling Shots, Bows and Arrows, and Fire Works are prohibited.
- 8. Fires and Cooking Grills prohibited except by special permit.
- 9. Golfing/Practice prohibited.
- 10. Unauthorized vehicles prohibited from driving/ parking on any town field without written permission.
- 11. If necessary these regulations shall be enforced by the Reading Police Department, who shall cause the immediate termination of any activity that violates these rules and regulations.
